After completion of this course, participant will be able to:

- Define analgesia, procedural sedation and deep sedation
- Define safe nursing care for the patient undergoing sedation in the pre-sedation phase, the intra-sedation phase, and the post-sedation phase.
- State two advantages/disadvantages associated with oral, sublingual, intramuscular, and intravenous medication administration.
- Describe the clinical implications of the most commonly utilized medications administered for procedural sedation, including, but not limited to: narcotics, benzodiazepines, ketamine and propofol.
- Delineate the requirements for intra and post procedure documentation.
- Describe the most common areas of sedation care which are open to interpretation in a medical legal environment
- Discuss practice issues for nurses administering procedural sedation in the State of Oregon as outlined in the nursing practice act.
- Define safe nursing care for the pediatric patient undergoing procedural sedation.
- Successfully complete a post-test, achieving an 80% accuracy score.

The day includes discussion of post-anesthesia management of the young and the elderly. Experienced PACU nurses may find this course to be a good review for the CPAN and CAPA examinations.
